

#### General Plan Overview

- The General Plan Update will reflect community goals and serve as the City's "constitution" or "blueprint" for future land use and planning decisions, including:
  - Land Uses (residential, commercial, industrial, business parks, open space, etc.)
  - Infrastructure Planning (roads, water, sewer, etc.)
  - Public Services (police, fire, parks, libraries, cultural activities, etc.)
  - Resource Conservation (historic structures, clean air, sensitive habitat, waterways, groundwater, etc.)




#### Purpose of the General Plan

- Define a long-term vision for future growth and resource management within the City over the next 20 years
- Reflect the goals and values of the City
- Build on recent City planning efforts (Specific Plans, etc)
- Include extensive public outreach and community participation
- Balance growth, conservation, and quality of life



### Existing General Plan

- Adopted in 1991. Hasn't been comprehensively updated in over 25 years.
- Numerous changes to State law
  - Climate change
  - Environmental justice
  - Complete streets
  - Flood protection



# Land Use Map Alternatives Report

- A range of Conceptual Land Use Maps will be developed.
  - Input from staff and City leadership will be incorporated.
  - Property owners will have opportunities to request land use changes.
  - Maps will depict differing levels of development intensity, location, and mix of uses.
  - Each Map Alternative will include an analysis of fiscal/economic implications, natural resource constraints, transportation implications, and growth projections.



## Goals, Policies, and Actions

#### Goals

Broad statements of community desires, preferences, and the General Plan's purpose

#### **Policies**

Guides to decision-makers with respect to development proposals, future growth and resource allocation

#### **Actions**

Implementation steps to ensure goals and policies are carried out



# Identifying Community Priorities

#### Three Visioning Workshops will be conducted

  - Communicating the intent of the General Plan Update

- Their primary purpose is to:
  - Develop a Vision Statement that guides the General Plan Update process


The General Plan Update Website is a great resource for reports, maps, newsletters, meeting agendas, meeting summaries, and upcoming meeting dates.

The site will also provide opportunities for **public surveys** and the submittal of public comments directly to the project team.

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

### Previous Meeting Summary

#### Assets

- Convenient freeway access to SR 99, SR 120, and I-5
- Connections to Bay Area, Fresno, and Sacramento

#### Challenges


- Truck traffic, especially near schools and residential areas
- Concerns about safety, especially around trucks

#### Vision

- Complete streets in central Lathrop
- Increased walking, biking, and transit opportunities
- Improved connectivity, especially across I-5
- Enhanced trail network and access, especially around levees and open spaces




## Regional Roadway Network






## Arterials Within Lathrop





## Bicycle Network






#### **Transit Connections**









- San Joaquin RTD connections to Stockton and Tracy (Routes 90, 97)
- Commuter bus connections to BART and Livermore (Routes 150, 152)
- ACE train commuter connections to Bay Area



## Measuring Congestion With LOS

- LOS = Level of Service
- Use of letter "grades" to assess intersection operations
- Measures driver comfort, road capacity utilization, and delay


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
#### Level of Service Tradeoffs



- Better LOS comes with tradeoffs
  - Vehicles move faster
  - Can be unreasonably expensive to build to LOS C or better
  - Faster vehicles may make walking and bicycling less safe or less attractive
  - Maintenance costs and stormwater runoff may be increased



#### Traffic Volumes and LOS






## Use of LOS is Changing


- Senate Bill 743 California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Reform Bill
  - LOS no longer required for CEQA purposes
  - Replaced by VMT (Vehicle Miles Traveled)
- SB 743 goals
  - Remove obstacle to infill development
  - Promote public health through walking and biking
  - Reduce greenhouse gas emissions
- But LOS is not going away: still used to evaluate local traffic impacts
  - Determine mitigation measures
  - Identify safety concerns
  - Test alternatives



### Traffic Impact Analysis with LOS


- Performance measure: intersection LOS
  - Number of peak hour trips
  - How many pass through each intersection
  - Delay for each vehicle
- Significance threshold
  - LOS goal from City's General Plan





### Traffic Impact Analysis with LOS

- Performance measure: Vehicle Miles of Travel
  - How many vehicle trips does project generate per day?
  - What is the travel distance of these trips?
- Significance threshold
  - VMT per capita/service population that is 15% below the City or Regional Average

#### **Automobile-Related**

e.g. traffic congestion, cut-through traffic, speeding



#### **Bicycle-Related**

e.g. lack of bike facilities, uncomfortable existing bike facilities



#### **Pedestrian-Related**

e.g. lack of crosswalks, missing sidewalks, uncomfortable/difficult crossings



#### **Transit-Related**

e.g. not enough stops, long waits



#### Other topics

e.g. maintenance issues, any other topics

### Transportation Priority Exercise


- Which two or three transportation improvements does your group think should be the top priorities for the General Plan Update?

  - Creating bicycle lanes
  - Improving crosswalks

  - Decreasing vehicle speeds
  - Adding transit service
